



## Risk Assessment Rig remote panning heads

The people that might be harmed: Studioworks employees, contractors, public, artists

HAZARD	CONTROL
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Awkward, heavy load.</li><li>• Panning head moving under remote operation whilst rigging is in progress.</li><li>• Trapped hands fingers.</li><li>• Electric shock from voltage on cables and equipment.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Use of competent operators to carry our task.</li><li>• Follow safe manual handling procedures.</li><li>• Ensure remote operation controls are disabled until rigging completed.</li><li>• Be aware of the hazard of trapping hands and fingers.</li><li>• Confirm EAW testing of cables and equipment.</li><li>• Visual check of cables and equipment prior to handling.</li><li>• Ensure that cables and equipment carrying mains voltages are rigged in such a way that they cannot be damaged by scenery or other equipment, or trapped in moving parts such as panning heads or crane pivots.</li><li>• Keep cables and equipment clear of heat from luminaires, and water.</li></ul>
